Andreas Rödder Biography

Andreas Rödder holds the Chair for Modern and Contemporary History at the Johannes Gutenberg University Mainz, and is Senior Fellow at John Hopkins SAIS, Washington D.C. His interests cover mid-Victorian English Conservatism, 20th Century German history and international politics, with a particular focus on the history of 1989-90 and contemporary history after 1990. He has published 6 major books, including a history of the Federal Republic of Germany, a history of German Reunification and a history of the "German problem" in Europe since the 19th century. His latest book analysing the rise and fall of the post-Cold War global order will be published in fall 2024.

Andreas Rödder gained his final degree (Staatsexamen) from the University of Tübingen in 1991, his PhD from the University of Bonn in 1995 and his Habilitation from the University of Stuttgart 2001. He has been Visiting professor at Brandeis University, Waltham, MA, at the London School of Economics and at Johns Hopkins SAIS, Washington, D.C., Fellow of the Historisches Kolleg Munich, and is member of the board of the Konrad Adenauer Foundation, President of the Stresemann Foundation, and founder and chairman of the German think tank "Republik21. Neue bürgerliche Politik".
